Candidates for office and elected officials are often vying for media coverage to promote their proposed legislation or campaign messages. In the traditional television and radio worlds, there are Federal Communications Commission (FCC) rules governing coverage of elected officials. In addition, such broadcast outlets usually require high advertising dollars to reach intended audiences. Live streaming offers a sought-after alternative. By using the power of live streaming to social media channels such as Facebook and YouTube, elected officials and candidates for office can now reach the masses without going through the expense or adhering to the guidelines that are typically required for a traditional broadcast experience. Recently, we had the opportunity to interview State Sen. Daylin Leach, a Democrat representing Pennsylvania's 17th district. Sen. Leach was excited to talk to viewers about his co-sponsorship of Senate Bill 350, for adult use of cannabis in Pennsylvania. While Leach had a variety of solutions he wanted to discuss as a result of this pending legislation, only a live stream would allow him adequate "air" time. With a live stream broadcast to Facebook, LinkedIn, Twitch and YouTube, Sen. Leach was able to reach a wide range of viewers.

During the in-studio interview, we used PTZOptics cameras, along with vMix software. The cameras allowed us to have high-quality pan-tilt-zoom shots, easily controlled through the software. vMix allowed us to create graphical overlays, also known as lower thirds, like the one here that shows the Senator's name.

Our interview included an IRL(In Real LIfe) component, where host Tess Protesto continued the conversation started with Sen. Leach out in the street. This offered another way to engage viewers in the live stream and also garner participation from those in the community.
